

**Lieutenant Commander Peter Ware Royal Navy, BSc(Hons) PG(Dip)**



Lieutenant Commander Peter Ware joined the Royal Navy in 2003. After attending Britannia Royal Naval College and completing underway training in HMS Ocean and HMS Echo he qualified as a Submarine Warfare Officer and was assigned to HMS Tireless as Casing Officer before joining Commander Task Force 311 at Northwood Headquarters as a Submarine Controller.

Returning to the surface fleet in 2009, Ware undertook assignments in HMS Chiddingfold and HMS Gloucester as Navigating Officer which included deployments to both the Middle East and South Atlantic, during which time he gained recommendation for specialist navigation training from Flag Officer Sea Training (South).

Ware qualified 'Spec-N' and as Principal Warfare Officer in 2012 before joining HMS Argyll in which he again deployed to the South Atlantic as PWO(A) and Operations Officer. During this deployment he acted as lead for the Ship's engagement with West African forces in developing Counter Piracy strategies for the region and with the US Joint Inter-Agency Task Force (South), conducting successful counter-narcotics operations with an embarked US Coast Guard Law Enforcement Detachment in both the Eastern Pacific Ocean and Caribbean Sea.

Following a brief assignment to HMS Illustrious as Navigating Officer where he was involved in the Ship providing humanitarian support to the Philippines, Ware joined FOST(S) as a Staff Warfare Officer (Navigation) in 2013 which involved training NATO and other partner nations' forces at sea both around the UK and locations around the World.

Currently assigned as a Senior Instructor to the United States Naval Academy in Annapolis, Ware instructs USNA Midshipmen both in the classroom and underway in locations along the Eastern United States seaboard while also coordinating the reintroduction of Celestial Navigation to the Academy's syllabus.
